OKAY, the challenge is on, you may react or respond. 1. One reaction would be to feel condemned or threatened or possibly even made unsure of your salvation. It is never my intent to make anyone feel any of these. But if this is you, maybe you should examine yourself to see if you are truly in "the faith". II Cor. 13:5 For if you are truly "His", and vou understand what that means, nothing I could ever do or say would be able to threaten that relationship. 2. You could also just blow me off, discarding that which you neither understand nor have experienced. Keep in mind that if I am right it is you, not I, that has so much to lose. Meanwhile my faith remains solid and fruitful regardless of your response. **3.** Or you could respond wisely and use this information to challenge all the you have been taught and hold dear and (as the Berean's did in (Acts 17:10-11) reexamine your theology and see if what I say is true, that you may experience God to an even greater degree. Scripture is clear, it is YOU that is to study the scriptures (not your pastor) to know what YOU should believe that YOU wont be put to shame. (II Tim. 2:15)

Please, do not confer with "flesh and blood", (Gal. 1:15-17) yours or another's, it will only rob you or lead you astray. Had I done so numerous times in my life I would not have many of the incredible testimonies displaying God's awesome love and power that I have today. Even the most well meaning pastors and spiritual leaders, who do not understand experientially or even theologically what I am saying, would have deterred me from knowing God as I do today. If you really "KNOW GOD", trust **Him** to lead you into all truth (Jn. 16:13) and then firmly stand on His Word and let Him prove ALL OTHERS wrong. (Ro. 1:3-4) His Word is true and faithful (Ps. 119:138) even when we are not. He is more than capable of defending His reputation. All you have to do is

BELIEVE, and then RECEIVE.

Do NOT let the <u>unbelief of others</u> rob YOU of all that GOD wants to give you.

About us.


